


Project Location

- Multimodal recommendations including bike/ped, transit, and I-30 capacity improvements


2005 Project Pegasus


- Included I-30 from Beckley Ave. to east of I-45 and I-35E from Colorado Blvd. to SH 183
- Approved schematic and environmental assessment
- Constructed I-30/I-35E Horseshoe Project

2016 CityMAP

- I-30 scenarios considered:
 - I-30 East Dallas below grade
 - Relocate I-30 to south








I-30 East Corridor public meeting June 8, 2021

Existing Roadway Typical Section



The existing roadway includes:

- Eight general purpose lanes (four in each direction)
- One reversible high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lane
- I-30 mainlanes and HOV lane are on an elevated bridge structure from I-345/I-45 to Haskell Avenue
- I-30 mainlane overpasses from Haskell Avenue to Dolphin Road
- Discontinuous frontage roads from two to three lanes in each direction





Proposed Roadway Typical Section



I-30 Segment Proposed Design: Reconstruct and widen highway, including:

- Ten mainlanes (five in each direction)
- I-30 mainlanes and managed lanes would be depressed below ground level from I-345/I-45 to Dolphin Road
- Two reversible managed lanes in center of highway
- Discontinuous at-grade frontage roads; two to three lanes in each direction
- Reconstruction of ramps and bridge structures
- Accommodations for bicycle/pedestrian travel are part of project development



*AUX = Auxiliary lane (a lane less than 1 mile in length that facilitates lane-to-lane weaving near exit or entrance ramps)

Cross Street Connections and "Complete Streets"



- Cross streets to be reconnected: Caldwell Street and Beeman Avenue
- 15 cross streets maintained with improved crossings over I-30
- Improved connectivity by network formed with new frontage roads




- Cross streets to follow City of Dallas 2016 Complete Streets Design Manual






Preliminary Concept Plan and Alternate Ramping/Access on Display




Preliminary Concept Plan and Alternate Ramping/Access on Display

Design Concept Roll 3: I-30 from KCS RR to East of Ferguson Road






The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable Federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried-out by TxDOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated December 9, 2019, and executed by FHWA and TxDOT.

Constraints Map

- The design team carefully considers social and environmental constraints during project development
- Constraints map developed early in project design from desktop data
- Examples of key constraints within the I-30 East Corridor:
 - Public parks / recreation areas
 - Rivers, streams, and wetlands
 - Floodplain areas
 - Historic properties
 - Cemeteries
 - Medical facilities, places of worship, schools and other public facilities
 - Railroads, utilities, hazmat sites
- Constraints map data followed by detailed studies during environmental assessment will further inform project design



Right-of-Way



Proposed Right-of-Way (ROW)

- Existing ROW: 195 feet to 483 feet in width
- Additional ROW is anticipated
- Final proposed ROW amount and relocation requirements will be identified after detailed schematic is developed
- Potential surplus ROW from areas no longer needed for I-30 will also be identified and action taken after construction
- All ROW acquisition follows Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended (for details see ROW publications at: https://www.txdot.gov/inside-txdot/forms-publications/publications/landowner-rights.html

Surplus Right of Way (ROW) Process



- Process begins once construction is complete, and is handled by TxDOT ROW Division, Real Estate Services
- Survey and appraisal of the surplus property are completed
- All offers are for appraised value only (not negotiable)
- 1st Priority: three local government agencies have 30 days to accept offer
 - City of Dallas
 - -- Dallas County
- Dallas ISD
- 2nd Priority: all abutting property owners have 30 days to accept offer
- 3rd Priority: offered to public for highest bidder above appraised value
 - Advertised daily in newspaper for two weeks
 - Offerors may submit sealed bids
 - Date/place specified for bid opening
 - Sold to highest bidder

Next Steps: I-45/I-345 Interchange Improvements



- Feasibility Study for I-345 underway by TxDOT
- Virtual and in-person public meetings to be held on Tuesday, June 22, 2021
- In-person meetings to be held at:
 - The Shed at the Dallas Farmers Market from 3-7PM
 - St. Philips School and Community Center from 4-8 PM
- Attendance at the in-person option will be by appointment only. In recognition of COVID-19, enhanced safety measures will be applied including a requirement to wear a face mask and follow social distancing practices.

City of Dallas Guiding Principles



Guiding Principles for I-30 Redesign

- Based on Foundational Studies, City's response to TxDOT should support guiding principles for redesign that will:
 - 1. Accommodate multi-modal connections across the I-30 corridor
 - Incorporate "complete streets" and other urban design elements to frontage roads
 - 3. New I-30 should not be any higher or any wider than the current I-30
 - Include "at-grade" crossings to improve neighborhood connectivity
 - Include better multi-modal connection to the High Speed Rail station area
 - 5. Maintain the street grid, where appropriate
 - Maximize development potential of abandoned right-of-way through ramp re-configuration
 - 7. Provide for strategic placement of deck parks
 - 8. Allow for alternative scenarios for I-345 redesign
 - Prefer that project include design and plans for construction of I-345 concurrent with I-30 project

PROJECT PARTNERS UNIFIED STATEMENT









Workgroup's Purpose: Unified approach to I-30 East Corridor goals by

- 1. Conducting inclusive, transparent, and collaborative public involvement;
- 2. Working collaboratively with stakeholders;
- 3. Evaluating recommendations from previous studies;
- 4. Providing the best solution for: safety, reliability, and operability, that includes strategies to improve equity (e.g., access/connectivity);
- 5. Producing defendable results, leading to a preferred alternative.

Workgroup Actions: Focus on sharing information on projects, such as

- Planned TxDOT transportation alternatives in Dallas;
- City street network and design directives/guidelines;
- NCTCOG's regional traffic model and metro transportation plan.

The workgroup supports TxDOT's process and is committed to working together for the duration of the I-30 East Corridor Project.

City of Dallas Partnership



- Providing for complete streets on I-30 bridge crossings and city streets
- Coordinating with adjacent property owners on access and city street grid
- Coordinating with TxDOT on locating viable deck plazas/parks
- Coordinating with TxDOT on allowances for surplus ROW
